

City of Vienna Mayor and Council met Monday, May 10, 2010 at Vienna City Hall. Mayor Emerson Lundy called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. with Brenda Gramm, Walter Brown, Beth English and Eddie Daniels present. Beth English opened meeting with prayer and everyone stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance. English made motion to approve agenda as presented, Gramm seconded and all voted to accept agenda. Brown moved to approve minutes from April 26 meeting, Daniels seconded all voted to approve except Gramm who abstained due to not being present at that meeting. Brown moved to approve minutes from May 3 called meeting, Gramm seconded and all voted to approve.

Two bids were submitted to council for mowing cemetery. Bid was awarded to lowest bidder, C & J's Lawn & Cleaning Service by motion from English, seconded by Daniels and unanimously approved. Two bids were received for cleaning floors at Senior Citizen Building. Daniels made motion to accept lowest bid, English seconded and all agreed to award contract to Dennard's Janitorials & Lawn Maintenance.

Janet Joiner, Community Development Director, gave Community Development Report. She advised that an application for 2010 CHIP Grant is Due June 30 for rehabilitation and reconstruction of housing. She also advised that Hwy 215 landscaping project starts this week and that Congressman Bishop and Senator Isakson are sending letters of support for grant application for Public Safety Building. Joiner also announced that Cargill bonds issued by Vienna Development Authority in 1995 had matured.

Chief Jamey Reed gave police report. Debra Spring gave financial report.

Solid waste amendment will be reviewed and finalized by City Attorney Verlin Jones, then presented to council for adoption.

Council reviewed Public Indecency Ordinance, but made no changes.

Gail Bemby, City Clerk, gave clerk's report.

Impounded vehicles are not ready to be made surplus, but English made motion to surplus miscellaneous items in impound. Daniels seconded and all agreed.

Daniels moved to approve excavation and trenching program for city employees. Brown seconded and program was unanimously approved.

English noted that elected officials will have to begin filing their reports online with State.

Kelvin Turner came before council to inform members that there would be a Family Day at the recreation department every 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday from 4 to 8 p.m. with activities and games for families and children.

Sylvester Granville had asked to speak to council, but Mayor Lundy noted that items that he wanted to discuss should be discussed with Board of Education, not City of Vienna.

Ms. Mattie Mays had presented a letter to council and she came before council to say that she does not believe that she should have to pay water bill from building on 111 E Union St. because she is not using water there even though she owns building. She stated that the water hose there did not belong to her.

English asked if city had received response from Steve Sanders of Dooly County concerning solid waste decisions within the city. Bemby advised that there had been no reply. Mayor Lundy asked that city hall be closed at 11 a.m. Thursday, May 13 so that employees could attend funeral services for former city council member, Dr. Napoleon Williams.

With no other business to come before council, meeting was adjourned.
